How is Our School Development Plan Used?

- Guides ongoing assessment and review of goals and actions.
- Our school development plan is the driver for closing learning gaps and informs:
 - Instructional strategies & Professional learning
 - School structures and processes for learning
 - Resources to improve student learning
 - Data-informed decision making
 - Selection of on- and off-site student activities and residencies





School Development Plan – School Goal

 Students' demonstration of resilience and risktaking at school will improve.





School Development Plan – Outcome

 Students report an increased feeling of connectedness within school through demonstrating a greater willingness to take social and academic risks.







School Development Plan – Outcome Measures

- Student perceptions on the Alberta Education Assurance Survey prompt "My teachers care about me".
- Student responses on the Grades 4-6 Our School Survey prompt "Is there an adult in the school that you would go to for help with a problem or a conflict?"
- Student responses on the Grades K-3 CBE Wellbeing Student Survey prompt "I have at least grown-up that I can talk to at school".
- Teacher perceptions of the impact of their intentional actions to create safe, welcoming and inclusive learning spaces (teacher surveys).







School Development Plan – Data for Monitoring Progress

- Pre and post survey data
- Teacher perceptions of student belonging and resiliency as raised in Collaborative Team Meetings and School Learning Team Meetings





School Development Plan – Actions

Learning Excellence

- Develop structures to support connectedness between classes, grades, etc.
- Support students in undertaking productive struggle in math problem solving by offering thought-provoking prompts, spaced practice, and encouragement.
- Offer explicit instruction and specific feedback throughout the writing process to empower students to take risks and to leverage new techniques in functional writing.





School Development Plan – Actions

Well-Being

- Nurture increased opportunities for connection through cross-grade buddies, student clubs, and regrouping of students for subject-specific instruction.
- Timetable allows for increased opportunities for teachers to build relationships with students.
- Acknowledge and celebrate risk-taking and growth mindset.





School Development Plan – Actions

Truth and Reconciliation, Diversity, and Inclusion

- Engage in whole school planning to develop robust and responsive extended programs, including professional learning, that are based on student feedback and encompass diverse student skills and interests.
- Students share thoughts and listen carefully to others through regular classroom sharing circles.
- Students can visibly see their culture within the school on the walls, in school and classroom library books, and through artwork, flags, posters, and other acknowledgements and celebrations.





School Development Plan – Actions

Professional Learning

- Teaching Effectiveness Framework
- Teachers work alongside published author and writing coach Suzy Vadori to support students in taking risks as writers.
- Continued development in trauma-aware practice.
- CBE Holistic Learning Framework: "Mind-To Know" domain.





School Development Plan – Actions

Structures and Processes

- Regular grade team meetings
- Regular collaborative team meetings
- Regular school learning team meetings
- Create common language (buffalo in a storm) with growth mindset, tackling challenges and fostering perseverance.

Our School Budget

- Our school received \$1.743 million in 2024-25 to provide a quality education to our 234 students and meet the goals in our school development plan (SDP).
- 82% of budgeted funds (min 75%) covers staffing and the remaining portion covers instructional and operational supplies.

Our 2024-25 School Fees

We will consult with families by outlining proposed activities for the upcoming year that may require a fee for cost recovery.

- Elbow Park Parent Society funds on- and off-site experiences that involve all students in the school (e.g. Alien In-line Skating, Elev8 Lacrosse, MadScience workshops, Engineering for Kids, etc...)
- Parents are only charged for field trips specific to their grade. Examples may include:
 - Granary Road
 - Arts Commons
- \$10 CBE Noon Activity Supply Fee: emergency lunches, cutlery & inclement weather activities

Based on last year's "EPPS Spending Family Survey" results, our current budget now includes three goals/criteria:

- 1. Align with CBE and EPS learning goals and values (inclusive, equity, students come first, learning is our central purpose, and public education serves the common good).
- 2. Enhance/enrich curricular learning outcomes
- 3. Ensure a variety of unique experiences for students

EPPS Society Budget Allocations:

The budget now contains categories for residencies to be offered, based on teacher and parent feedback:

- **Literacy**: Author Suze Vadori Writing Residency (multi-day and whole-school), Political Cartoonist (Gr.5-6)
- Math and/or Science, Technology: MadScience, Teacher's Pet in-class workshops
- Wellness, culture and fine arts: Fiddler, Veterans, Irish Dance
- Physical Education: Elev8 Lacrosse, Afrobeat Dance, Green Fools Circus Skills, Frisbee Rob disc golf, Curling, Physical Education Equipment
- Technology (hardware & software): iPads (x6)
- James Short Memorial School (ie. shared dance residency: AfroBeat)

James Short Memorial Shared Experience Funding:

This school year, EPPS funded the same Sound Kreations Afrobeat Dance residency at James Short Memorial School (JSM) as our students will have. This offered a common learning experience that students from both schools could connect with. Our homeroom classes are connected to classrooms at JSM for penpals and sharing other learning experiences.

JSM offers many community-funded programs such as breakfast/lunch programs and funding for library books and other classroom resources. They have not been able to provide unique learning experiences like our students have access to due to lack of fundraised dollars.
